### GCSE Geology Fieldtrip

Mr Grant and I took my GCSE Geology group on the second fieldtrip of their course. We visited the picturesque Lulworth Cove & Durdle Door on the Jurassic Coast, which none of the students had previously experienced, and what a beautiful day it was! The sun shone upon us as we hiked the coastal path in our T-shirts, and we marvelled at the wonderful views beneath blue, cloudless skies (in November... the Climate Crisis is upon us). Students expressed their enjoyment and fascination over what they saw.

A few of my favourite quotes from students include "that is actually really incredible" and "I am sure I've seen that on a fridge magnet", which were comments made whilst at the enchanting Durdle Door. Some other good ones were "I think my heart is going to explode" (which I interpreted as overwhelming joy as opposed to painstaking strain from walking), and "Sir, I am reporting you to Mrs Capaldi for making us climb this vertical, snake-infested hill of death", which was a comment made by Junior after we discovered an adder on a very steep coastal path, that miraculously reanimated after I had assured the students it was dead.

The aim of our trip was to study the geological history and formation of Lulworth Cove & Durdle Door. Other than having to resort to a Plan B at one particular stage of the fieldwork, when we realised that our path had been cut off by a rather large landslide, all else was successful (besides time parameters... only two hours out) and I have no doubt that students gained a wealth of geological knowledge and information.





